



A MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Every year a report is prepared for all parishioners detailing the most important statistics, financial accounts, and activities of our parish. It is an attempt to give a picture of our progress and leads us to reflect on how we still need to move forward.

Thank you for being such a wonderful part of our Catholic life in Lumen Christi Parish. I feel that we have steadied ourselves as a parish and started to grow. All of our four churches often have an increased number of Sunday worshippers. For example, you will note that during the Mass count in November last year our Sunday Mass attendance had grown to an average of 1,065 people (including those who attend Mass in Italian and Vietnamese at St John Vianney Co-Cathedral, Fairy Meadow).

During 2023 we sought comments about what should be included in the Christ in You Pastoral Plan. From the Pastoral Plan Strategic Group a writing group was established consisting of Lisa de Paiva (Pastoral Council Chair), Kathy Uroda (St Brigid's Primary Principal), and Vicki Davidson (now Finance Council Chair) under the guidance of Marie Smith who conducted the reflections of the Strategic Group according to the Appreciative Enquiry method.

Two documents were developed and were distributed after a final short consultation process. The first smaller document - the Pastoral Plan itself - will be printed in an accessible size that can fit into a person's hand and be easily given to someone else for their reflection. It has the five key points of the Plan - Community Life, Worship, Mission, Stewardship, Parish Support - with an appropriate quote from the Letter to the Colossians and a two line description of what each category calls us to do. This first document gives us the compass points (attitudes and main goals) for our parish activities over the next few years.

The second document has a more detailed list of practical goals for each category of the Pastoral Plan to be developed by a group appropriate to each area of activity. The goals are being published in the Bulletin over the Sundays of Lent for all parishioners' reflection and any suggestions that flow from that reflection. These practical goals will help us translate our compass points (attitudes and main goals) into a living service of love and growth.

In Jesus, the Word made flesh who dwells among us, every year is a year of grace and all points of the compass are indications from God to help us know the way. Giving thanks for all the good that was done by so many parishioners - musicians, singers, cantors, catechists, teachers, servers, readers, collectors, charity volunteers, morning tea welcomers, garden workers, and so many more - let us trust in God's goodness and renew our enthusiasm for bearing witness to the love and mercy of Christ.

God bless you all and all your families and loved ones.

Amidst these challenges, I am pleased to inform you that our Pastoral Plan is well underway. This strategic initiative will guide our actions and decisions in the coming years, ensuring that our parish continues to grow spiritually and serve as a beacon of light in the community.

I extend my deepest gratitude to each and every one of you for your continued support, dedication, and prayers. May the upcoming year be filled with blessings, unity, and prosperity for Lumen Christi Parish.

PARISH FINANCIALS

Audit

Lumen Christi Parish is audited annually by our parish auditor Mr Kevin Mehl. The parish audit for 2023 was completed on 16th January 2024. The financial statements of the Lumen Christi Catholic Parish Wollongong are properly drawn up so as to present fairly the results of the parish for the financial year ended 31 December 2023 and the financial position of the parish at that date.

In all material respects, the entity has complied with the Catholic Diocese of Wollongong Parish Accounting and Administrative Policies and Procedures.

Auditors Management Review

- The deficit for the year was (\$28,463) which was less than 2022 by (\$331,334). Details of these variations are set out in the Income and Expenditure analysis.
- There was a positive Cash Flow for the year of \$953,508, compared to a negative in 2022 of (\$336,658), a positive movement of \$1,290,166. *(The main reason for this positive cash flow was the net proceeds of \$946,013.97 from the sale of 123 Gipps Road Gwynneville).*
- All bank statements have been reconciled as at 31st December 2023 and cash holdings are correctly reflected in the Accounts.
- Property valuations have decreased by \$37,058 for the year.
- The Liability of \$40,663 is calculated by the Diocesan Payroll Service.
- Parish Income for the year of \$875,779 which was greater than 2022 by \$56,267.
- Parish Expenditure for the year was \$904,242 which was less than 2022 by \$275,068.
- There was an increase in the Second Collection from \$251,406 to \$273,033.



As of May 2023, Catholic Church Insurance has unfortunately ceased operations. In response to this development, the Catholic Diocese of Wollongong appointed a new insurance provider to ensure the continuity of coverage for our church buildings and contents.

Regrettably, due to various factors, there has been an unexpected increase in the insurance premium. The new premium rates will reflect an increase of 52%. Insurance premiums will be reviewed in the coming months of 2024.






Financial Revenue


Statement of Revenue - January to December 2023

Income by Revenue Type (Percentage): 2023




Financial Expenditure


Statement of Expenditure - January to December 2023



November 2023 Mass Attendance


During the month of November 2023, the Diocese of Wollongong conducted Mass attendance counts. Lumen Christi Parish has witnessed remarkable growth in attendance. In particular, our English-speaking Mass attendance has seen a significant increase, rising from **683** in **2022** to **978** in **2023**. Increase in attendance by **43.2%**

This positive trend extends to the overall Mass attendance for all our Masses (English and Non-English speaking) where we experienced growth from **776** in **2022** to **1065** in **2023**. Increase in attendance by **37.2%**

The active participation in our spiritual gatherings is not only a source of joy but also a reflection of the deep sense of faith and fellowship that defines Lumen Christi Parish.

Let us carry this spirit of gratitude into our celebrations and reflect on the many blessings that bind us as one faith community. Our next annual Mass attendance will be conducted in November 2024.


HOSPITAL CHAPLAINCY

Fr John Stork is the Wollongong Private and Public Hospital Chaplain. In this capacity, Fr John provides sacraments and spiritual support within our local hospitals.



Parish collections

A parish is dependent on the generosity of its parishioners to sustain itself and its many charitable and pastoral works. Generally, this support is through two collections at each Sunday Mass.

FIRST COLLECTION FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CLERGY

Historically, these have been funds for the parish priest to use as an allowance for his financial livelihood, a stipend (small salary) for the assistant priest(s), and his weekly sustenance. After the Second Vatican Council in the early 1960s dioceses were encouraged to establish a central fund to which the proceeds of each parish's first collection (less their deductions for sustenance needs) was directed and from which stipends were then paid according to an equitable arrangement.

In 1984, a central fund known as the Clergy Remuneration Fund was established.

Today, this fund provides for a priest's:

- Monthly stipend
- Private health insurance
- Superannuation contribution

This fund also provides a co-contribution towards the financial support of a priest who is on light duties due to ill health or who has retired.

Planned Giving (which comprises envelopes and direct debits) and any loose cash donated at this collection are banked into a parish account which is overseen by your Parish Finance Council. The many costs of running a parish are deducted from this account. Some of the expenses covered include:

- Parish operating costs such as insurance, utilities, telecommunications, general maintenance and upkeep of the church, presbytery, buildings and parish property
- Any loan debt servicing for parish buildings
- Parish pastoral programs
- Parish staff salaries including superannuation
- Car expenses for the priest(s) in the parish
- A Cathedraticum (contribution) to the Bishop towards the costs of running the Diocese (10%) of the collection revenue.

The Envelope Collection is part of the Parish Plan Giving Programme whereby a family chooses to take a set of envelopes for the year, marked with the date for each week, and decides on an agreed amount they will contribute. BEQUEST GIVING

Remembering your faith community in your Will

After providing for family members in your Will, have you ever considered leaving a bequest directly to your local parish? This is called a legacy or bequest.

Over the years, many people who have felt a special connection with their local parish have left part of their Estate to be used for the need of the Parish. Like a gift to a charity, a bequest of any amount to the Church is a way of saying “thank you” for the spiritual nurturing provided to you and your family over the years.

Your Parish

Many of us have a special connection to our parish, nurtured by years of faith-sharing, schooling, friendships, and support.

A bequest to your parish, no matter how small, will help the faith community which has meant so much to you to continue its good works and its loving outreach. It is also a means by which you can plan a lasting gift for your parish which might not be possible in your lifetime.

In receiving a bequest, a parish may be able to use the gift to attend to much-needed maintenance and improvements to the church and other Parish property or put the gift towards building a new church or refurbishing their existing one. These kinds of gifts help the Parish free up other income to use toward pastoral care programs.

The need for material and spiritual assistance provided by the parish is always growing. One of the many areas of need is to provide financial support in ongoing operational costs such as utility costs, wages for parish staff, and repairs and maintenance of our church buildings.

No matter the size of the gift, a bequest of any kind in your Will can make a significant difference.

Your Gift

The following are some examples of how a bequest may be given:

- A Specific Bequest: a detailed gift, for example, an item of property, shares, or an insurance policy

- Percentage of your Estate: nominating a set percentage of your Estate for your chosen beneficiaries
- Residuary Bequest: nominating a beneficiary to receive any leftover monies from your Estate
- Whole Estate: nominating your entire Estate for your chosen beneficiary
