It will be held on **Friday 14th September, the Feast of The Exaltation of the Holy Cross**, at **12.10pm** followed by refreshments. This initiative is sponsored by our CWL. Let people know who have had loved ones die in tragic circumstances.



### Tips for the Reception of Holy Communion

As a result of the recent in-service for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion in our pastoral region, the participants raised a number of concerns about the reception of Holy Communion:

Bow before you receive the Host. Please do not genuflect as this may cause problems for the person immediately behind you.

Please indicate clearly the way you intend to receive the Host—on the hand or, on the tongue.

When receiving the Host on the Hand, place your dominant hand below the other hand and present them to the Communion Minister. Reply with “Amen”. Step to the side, consume the Host, make the Sign of the Cross, and then proceed to the Chalice Minister or to your pew.

When receiving the Chalice, reply with “Amen” and sip only from the Chalice. Make the Sign of the Cross and then return to your pew.

It is important that we re-visit our disposition to the reception of Holy Communion every so often. Furthermore, as we walk to receive the Host and the Chalice, as well as when we return to our seats, it is good practice to be praying in thanksgiving for the great gift of the Eucharist.

It is helpful that parishioners who find it difficult to walk up the Communion aisle, be seated in the front pews.

Please be respectful of the prayerfulness of parishioners before and after the Mass.

Our children’s First Holy Communion program commences shortly. We keep them in our prayers in this period of preparation. Thanks to Cathy Zamroz, our two school communities and catechists for their involvement in our Sacraments Program.

## **Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults**

RCIA is a spiritual journey into the Catholic faith. It is an exploration into Catholic teachings, traditions and practices. Participants attend weekly sessions which begin around September each year. It is a process whereby adults become full participating members of the church through a series of rites which conclude at the Easter Vigil service.
